### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ON KNOWLEDGE PARTNERSHIP

#### 1. Parties to the MoU

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is entered into between: Olive Foundation Trust, a registered public charitable trust established in 2013, working across multiple states in India in the areas of education, skilling, livelihoods, health, and digital inclusion, having its registered office at Mahaveer The Water mark, Mazzanine Floor 9, White Fields Road,

Kondapur, Hyderabad, Telangana-500081. hereinafter referred to as “Olive Foundation” or ‘Olive’,

**AND**

Malla Reddy College of Engineering, an educational institution affiliated to JNTU University having its campus at Maisammaguda, Dulapally, Hyderabad, Telangana 500100.

Olive Foundation and the Malla Reddy College of Engineering shall here in after be individually referred to as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties”.

**2. Purpose of the MoU**

The purpose of this MoU is to establish a collaborative framework between Olive Foundation Trust and the College for the

- ✓ Implementation of student-centric and community-focused programs
- ✓ Employability enhancement
- ✓ Emerging Technologies training
- ✓ Women Empowerment initiatives
- ✓ Health & Hygiene awareness
- ✓ CSR-aligned interventions
- ✓ Digital & Employment Skilling for Youth
- ✓ Menstrual Health Access & Awareness
- ✓ Women’s Livelihood Promotion
- ✓ Impact Documentation & Data Systems

This collaboration aims to enhance student employability, exposure to industry-relevant skills, and social impact initiatives within the College ecosystem.

**3. Scope of Collaboration**

Under this MoU, Olive Foundation, in collaboration with the College, may implement the following programs based on mutual agreement and project-specific approvals:

- Digital, IT & Emerging Technology Skilling (AI, Data Analytics, Cyber security, Cloud,

- Employability & Career Readiness Programs
- Industry Interaction, Expert Talks & Workshops
- Women Empowerment & Livelihood Programs

- Health, Hygiene & Menstrual Awareness Programs
- CSR-sponsored training and awareness initiatives
- Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), where applicable
- Student certification and assessment-based programs

Specific program details, duration, beneficiary targets, and funding arrangements shall be defined separately through Annexures or Project Charters.

#### **4. Roles & Responsibilities of Olive Foundation Trust**

Olive Foundation shall:

- Design and provide program frameworks, curricula, training plans, and implementation Guidelines.
- Deploy qualified trainers, resource persons, or authorized implementation partners.
- Provide standardized branding, IEC materials, certificates, and reporting formats.
- Ensure alignment with sponsor / CSR partner guidelines, where applicable.
- Monitor program quality, delivery standards, and outcomes.
- Facilitate certifications, assessments, and impact documentation.

#### **5. Roles & Responsibilities of the College / Institution**

The College shall:

- Nominate a Single Point of Contact (SPOC) for coordination with Olive Foundation.
- Provide necessary infrastructure such as classrooms, labs, internet, and audio-visual facilities as required.
- Mobilize and register eligible students / beneficiaries for the programs.
- Ensure attendance, discipline, and participation of students.
- Facilitate permissions, schedules, and internal coordination with departments.
- Support data collection, assessments, and feedback processes.
- Allow branding and visibility of Olive Foundation and sponsors within the campus as per Guidelines.

#### **6. Financial Terms**

This MoU does not create any automatic financial liability on either Party unless specified in a project-specific annexure. Programs may be funded through CSR partners, government

schemes, sponsors, or self-funded models, as mutually agreed. Any commercial or cost-sharing arrangements shall be detailed separately and approved in writing by both Parties.

## **7. Branding & Publicity**

All branding, communication, and publicity related to the programs shall follow Olive Foundation's branding and sponsor guidelines.

- The College may publicize the collaboration for academic and outreach purposes with prior intimation to Olive Foundation.
- No Party shall misuse the name, logo, or identity of the other Party.

## **8. Confidentiality**

Both Parties agree to maintain confidentiality of:

- Project documents, training content, and proprietary information
- Beneficiary data and personal information
- Sponsor details and commercial terms, where applicable

Confidential information shall not be disclosed to any third party without prior written consent.

## **9. Monitoring, Reporting & Evaluation**

- Olive Foundation may conduct monitoring visits, audits, or reviews during the program Period.
- The College shall provide necessary support for impact assessment and reporting. Joint reviews may be conducted to assess outcomes and scope for future collaboration.

## **10. Term & Termination**

- This MoU shall be effective from the date of signing and remain valid for the agreed Duration unless terminated earlier.
- Either Party may terminate the MoU by giving 30 days' written notice.
- Immediate termination may occur in case of breach of confidentiality, misconduct, or Non-compliance with agreed terms.

## **11. Dispute Resolution**

Any dispute arising out of this MoU shall be resolved amicably through mutual discussion. If unresolved, the matter shall be referred to arbitration under the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The venue of arbitration shall be [City], and the proceedings shall be conducted in English.

## **12. Governing Law & Jurisdiction**

This MoU shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of India.

### 13. Non-Exclusivity

This MoU is non-exclusive, and both Parties are free to collaborate with other organizations for similar activities.

### 14. Amendments

Any amendment or modification to this MoU shall be valid only if made in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both Parties.


