Introduction

Continuing its commitment towards the nationwide movement for cleanliness, the NSS Unit of Malla Reddy College of Engineering (MRCE) organized the Swachhata Hi Seva 2025 Campaign 5.0 on September 25, 2025, with the theme:

Event Details

Inaugural Session

The campaign was conducted in the MRCE Ground in front of the Main Block, under the leadership of:

- Dr. M. Ashok, Principal & NSS Chairman MRCE
- Mr. G. Ratnakumar, NSS Programme Officer

Before commencing the activity, the Principal addressed the volunteers, highlighting that "cleanliness is not just an activity, but a way of life that reflects discipline, responsibility, and respect for the community." He motivated the students to consider cleanliness as a continuous practice, not a one-day task.

The NSS Programme Officer, Mr. Ratnakumar, briefed the volunteers about the **objectives of the drive**, the importance of their role in the community, and how their actions contribute to the larger goal of a clean and green nation.

Cleanliness Drive

A hands-on cleanliness drive was carried out by 30 NSS Volunteers along with the guidance of the Principal and NSS-PO. The activity began with volunteers equipped with gloves, brooms, and garbage collection bags, taking up designated areas around the MRCE Ground.

The volunteers worked in teams to:

- Sweep and clean the premises in front of the Main Block.
- Collect litter and segregate waste into biodegradable and non-biodegradable categories.
- Remove plastic waste and wrappers from open spaces to promote a plastic-free campus.
- Restore tidiness by clearing corners, pathways, and seating areas within the ground.

Through this **practical approach**, the volunteers not only cleaned the environment but also set an example for their peers and staff members about the power of collective action.

Impact and Learning
