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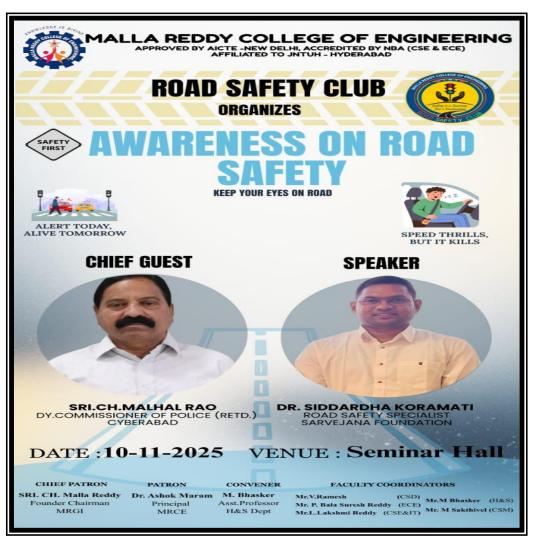

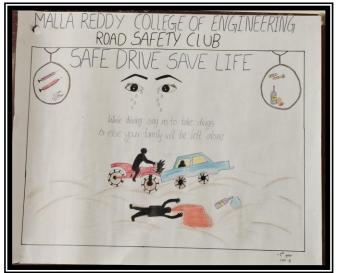
This initiative fostered a collective commitment among students and faculty to create safer road environments and support sustainable development goals by combining traditional wisdom with modern road safety education

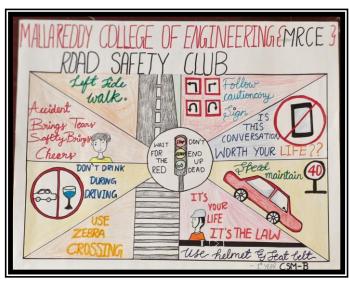

5. Program Proceedings

The Program began with an invocation, followed by a welcome address by the Convener. The Program featured two awareness sessions:



Session 1 –



- Dr. Siddardha Koramati from Sarvejana Foundation presented a professional and impactful overview of the Foundation's road safety efforts.
- He emphasized Sarvejana's commitment to reducing road accidents by 5% over the next decade through strategic awareness campaigns and partnerships with government and community stakeholders.
- The foundation's approach is based on the 5 Es of Road Safety: Education, Engineering, Enforcement, Emergency Care, and Empowerment.
- Key initiatives include school and community awareness programs, junction adoption, free medical services, first-aid training, and the use of technology like the Smart Helmet and STOP Road Accidents app.
- The campaign addresses major risky behaviors termed the "7 Deadly Sins" (e.g., nonuse of helmets, seat belts, over speeding).
- Emphasis is placed on children as influencers to promote safer driving habits in families.
- The foundation's outreach has educated hundreds of thousands and actively promotes sustained road safety culture through competitions, pledges, and digital engagement.
- Overall, the awareness outlines a professional, multi-faceted strategy aimed at lasting impact and lives saved on roads.



Sri. Ch. Malhal Rao, Dy. Commissioner of Police (Retd.), emphasized that roads are not meant for racing and highlighted high road accident and youth fatality rates, emphasizing that safety is a personal responsibility and most crashes are preventable. He identified major causes such as over-speeding, wrong-lane driving, not using helmets, drunk or drowsy driving, and mobile phone distraction, and underlined the critical "Golden Hour" and timely use of emergency services for saving lives.

He outlined the 3Es of road safety—Education, Enforcement and Engineering—calling for active roles from educational institutions, police/transport authorities and road designers, along with proper vehicle maintenance and disciplined driving behavior. He concluded with a strong call and pledge to always use helmets and seat belts, avoid alcohol and mobile phones while driving, and to always choose life over speed.

✓ 6. Road Safety Awareness Program Outcomes:

- 1. Enhanced Public Awareness and Responsibility: The program successfully reinforced that road safety is a shared personal responsibility, emphasizing preventive behavior and informed decision-making among youth and general road users.
- 2. Promotion of the 3Es and 5Es Frameworks: It strengthened understanding of comprehensive road safety strategies through the 3Es (Education, Enforcement, Engineering) and extended 5Es (adding Emergency Care and Empowerment), encouraging collaboration between institutions, authorities, and communities.
- **3. Behavioral Change and Safety Commitment:** Participants pledged to adopt disciplined driving habits—always wearing helmets and seat belts, avoiding alcohol and mobile phones while driving, and prioritizing life over speed.
- **4.** Community Engagement and Technological Integration: The Sarvejana Foundation's initiatives, such as Smart Helmet technology, junction adoption, and the STOP Road Accidents app, fostered community participation and technology-driven safety solutions.

5. Sustained Impact through Education and Outreach: Through school programs, competitions, and digital campaigns, the foundation cultivated long-term awareness, empowering children as influencers and reaching hundreds of thousands to promote a continuous culture of road safety.

8. Conclusion

The Road Safety Club effectively bridges traditional safety principles with modern education. It inspires faculty and students to integrate road safety awareness into teaching and campus life. Departments are motivated to launch initiatives promoting responsible road use. Through awareness campaigns and interactive sessions, the club fosters a culture of safety and accountability. These collective efforts aim to reduce accidents and build safer communities.
