

INAUGURATION


COMPETITION

JURY

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Round 1 – Warm-up (Speed & Logic):

- **Logical Accuracy (30 pts):** Correctness of outputs for given problems. **Speed & Efficiency (40 pts):** Time taken to solve problems and handle test cases. **Designing & Presentation(30 pts):** Clarity, creativity, and structured presentation of the solution.
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Round 2 – Advanced Coding Challenge:

- **Technical Implementation (50 pts):** Quality of code, functionality, and proper application of programming concepts.
- **Optimization & Efficiency (30 pts):** Handling of time/space complexity, edge cases, and scalable solutions.
- **Creativity & Problem-Solving Approach (20 pts):** Innovative ways of structuring the solution, not just brute force.

Evaluation Process:

The evaluation of Innovate Xpress followed a two-stage process to ensure fairness, transparency, and credibility in the final results.

- **Round 1 – Faculty Evaluation:**

Faculties reviewed all submissions, assessed them based on creativity, relevance, and adherence to the problem, and shared the compiled zip files with the organizing team.

- **Round 2 – AI Evaluation:**

An AI system filtered the submissions, analyzed key parameters (accuracy, innovation, quality), and declared the winners through an unbiased automated process.

This dual-layered evaluation mechanism—combining human expertise with AI efficiency—helped ensure that the best-performing teams were recognized fairly.

Evaluation Criteria:

Our project will be evaluated based on the following parameters:

1. Innovation & Creativity – 30%
2. Design & User Experience – 20%
3. Technical Implementation – 20%
4. Impact & Usefulness – 20%
5. Completeness – 10%
