



Raksha Bandhan Celebrations - Report



The Indian Knowledge System Cell of Malla Reddy College of Engineering organised a series of Raksha Bandhan celebrations from 26th July to 9th August 2025, blending cultural tradition, patriotism, and environmental responsibility. The programme began on 26th July 2025 with students enthusiastically making handmade, eco-friendly rakhis for soldiers serving at the nation's borders. These rakhis, symbolising gratitude and respect, were later handed over to the Samskruthi Foundation for distribution. On 7th August 2025, faculty members and students visited local army units and personally tied rakhis to soldiers, engaging in warm interactions that fostered mutual respect and a deeper understanding of the sacrifices made by the armed forces.

The celebrations continued on 8th August 2025 with a visit to the Raj Bhavan, where representatives from MRCE tied rakhis to the Hon'ble Governor and security personnel, symbolising honour towards leadership and appreciation for those safeguarding important state institutions. The final day, 9th August 2025, was celebrated in the college with the theme Vruksha Raksha (protection of trees). The day began with tying rakhis to plants, promoting the message of environmental conservation. A formal programme followed in the seminar hall, including an audio-visual presentation on the significance of Raksha Bandhan, welcoming of dignitaries, a speech by the IKS Convener, and an inspiring address by the Principal emphasising unity, cultural values, and environmental stewardship.
